Student Board Representative Kiara Espericueta provided a report of the activities and events occurring at the district's high schools.

The Board recognized Kiara for her tenure on the Board of Education as the Student Board Representative.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Greg Plutko opened his report by welcoming everyone to the new year. He shared that every January the Governor comes out with a proposed budget to be approved in May. This year Governor Brown made a decision to support public education. It appears to be positive and supportive and fully fund LCFF two years ahead of schedule. We should feel the Governor has heard us regarding fair and full funding for public schools.

Dr. Plutko thanked the Maintenance and Facilities staff for their hard work during the winter break from working on buses to working on projects at individual school sites.

Superintendent Plutko asked Educational Services Director Cary Johnson to begin to talk about a phrase, "developing a future-ready district." We need to share with the Board specific examples of actions and behaviors that show that everyday differences are being made for all of our students and staff in becoming a future-ready district. At board meetings over the next four months, we will have brief examples of our progress in all that we are doing to be a future-ready district. Director Cary Johnson and Instructional Coach Kim Voge provided a brief presentation on innovation technology examples, highlighting AppJam+. Finally, Dr. Plutko presented Kim Voge with the "golden keyboard" award for her teacher leadership in innovation technology across the district.

RESOLUTION NO. 21

Authorization to Apply for and Secure Grant Funding from the South Coast Air Quality Management District PA #2018-02 AB 923 School Bus Replacement Program

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District of Orange County, State of California, has determined the District's transportation needs; and

Whereas, the District is in need of replacing six school buses under PA #2018-02 released by the SCAQMD at the October 6, 2017 SCAQMD Board Meeting, and said program to be administered by the SCAQMD when awards are announced at the SCAQMD Board Meeting on April 6, 2018.

Whereas, this grant is for replacement of pre-1994 model year school buses with a mandatory school district match portion. The grant application process for these SCAQMD AB 923 funds requires that the school board commit in advance, through this resolution, to match funds for all of the buses awarded, in addition to committing to pay for any additional options above the grant amount, such as required special needs equipment that might also be on the bus granted and ordered from the bus vendor. The Board of Trustees by this resolution is also showing that they are fully committed to obtaining these grants and following through with all of the requirements of this grant program.

Whereas, the school match requirements and the cost of the additional options required for six buses is up to approximately \$40,000 per bus, for a total of up to \$240,000 to be paid by Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Board of Trustees of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District does hereby authorize the school district's representative, Dr. Greg Plutko, to apply for and secure all possible funding for the replacement of six school buses with a commitment by this Board through this resolution to pay all school match money required, and additional option costs, on any buses granted through the SCAQMD AB 923 program, PA #2018-02.

RESOLUTION NO. 22
RESOLUTION CALLING FOR FULL AND FAIR FUNDING
OF CALIFORNIA'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS
January 16, 2018**

ON MOTION of Member Eric Padgett seconded by Member Karin Freeman, the following resolution is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, California has the sixth largest economy in the world, and the largest Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of any state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, despite California's leadership in the global economy, the state falls in the nation's bottom quintile on nearly every measure of public K-12 school funding and school staffing; and

WHEREAS, California ranks 45th nationally in the percentage of taxable income spent on education, 41st in per-pupil funding, 45th in pupil-teacher ratios and 48th in pupil-staff ratios; and

WHEREAS, K-12 school funding has not substantially increased, on an inflation-adjusted basis, for more than a decade; and

WHEREAS, under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), state funding for K-12 schools has only this year recently returned to levels predating the Great Recession of 2007; and

WHEREAS, the modest revenue increases since the implementation of LCFF have been eroded by rapidly increasing costs for health care, pensions, transportation and utilities; and

WHEREAS, 58 percent of California's public school students are eligible for free and reduced-price lunch — 13 percent above the national average — and 23 percent of California students are English learners, more than twice the national average; and

WHEREAS, California's investment in public schools is out of alignment with its wealth, its ambitions, its demographics and the demands of a 21st-century education; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, a bipartisan group of California leaders commissioned a report titled *Getting Down to Facts*, which stated it would take an additional \$17 billion annually to meet the State Board of Education achievement targets for K-12 schools; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, a California School Boards Association (CSBA) report, *California's Challenge: Adequately Funding Education in the 21st Century*, updated the *Getting Down to Facts* data and determined that, adjusting for inflation, an additional \$22 billion to \$40 billion annually would be required to provide all public school students with access to a high-quality education; and

WHEREAS, California funds schools at roughly \$1,961 per student less than the national average, which translates to approximately \$3,462 per student when adjusted for California being a high-cost state; and

WHEREAS, California trails the average of the top 10 states by almost \$7,000 in per-pupil funding; and

WHEREAS, in *Robles-Wong v. State of California*, a group of plaintiffs led by CSBA argued that California's school funding system violated Article IX of the State Constitution by denying all students access to an education that prepares them for economic security and full participation in our democratic institutions; and

WHEREAS, the California Supreme Court declined to hear the case by a 4-3 margin, prompting Justice Goodwin H. Liu to write: "It is regrettable that this court, having recognized education as a fundamental right in a landmark decision 45 years ago [*Serrano v. Priest* (1971) 5 Cal.3d 584], should now decline to address the substantive meaning of that right."; and

WHEREAS, in order to prepare our students for participation in a democratic society and an increasingly competitive, technology-driven global economy, California must fund schools at a level sufficient to support student success; and

WHEREAS, despite its vast wealth, California has consistently underfunded public education while widening its scope, adding new requirements and raising standards without providing appropriate resources to prepare all students for college, career and civic life; and

WHEREAS, if California is to close opportunity and achievement gaps and create a public school system that offers consistently high levels of education, the State must provide schools with the resources to meet the needs of their specific populations;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing board of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District urges the State Legislature to fund California public schools at the national average or higher by the year 2020, and at a level that is equal to or above the average of the top 10 states nationally by 2025 and to maintain, at a minimum, this level of funding until otherwise decreed.
