1. Mrs. Janice Wagner was pleased to have been part of the PLUM Community Recognition Dinner and expressed how blessed the district is to have such wonderful community members. She was privileged to have met with State legislators at a recent breakfast meeting and provided Board members a packet of information put together by Assemblyman Mike Duvall regarding pending bills. Mrs. Wagner also joined Dr. Dennis Smith and Mr. Doug Domene in a meeting with Assemblyman Bob Huff regarding state

budget concerns. Mrs. Wagner shared information relative to her visits to Rio Vista and Melrose Elementary Schools and spoke briefly regarding preschool, CBET, and Vantage programs; indicated she and Karin Freeman had visited Yorba Linda Middle School; and added that she had met with Principal Minerva Gandara-Boggs regarding Valadez Middle School. WHEREAS, disbursements and revenues applicable to this fund may be made for educational and special education facility construction on a project-by-project basis that will include any and all costs necessary to adequately house these students in accordance with Health and Safety Codes 33401, 33676, 33607.5 and 33607.7; and

WHEREAS, the cash in such fund may be invested and reinvested by the County Treasury, with investment earnings being considered as income to the fund; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board hereby authorizes the Administration to establish a School Facilities Agency Fund with the County Treasurer for the purpose of accumulating and expending redevelopment agency income.

Students and employees are encouraged to avail themselves of the information, knowledge, and materials available through electronic mail, other electronic learning resources, and the Internet for purposes of classroom assignments, research projects, or job-related activities as outlined in the Student/Network Use Agreement.

Use of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District's technology and electronic network system is a privilege and comes with much the same privileges and responsibilities associated with use of the library or other reference sources as outlined in the Student/Network Internet Acceptable Use Agreement. Access to the Internet is provided to students for purposes of learning, and therefore should be used for educational purposes, and in the case of employees, primarily for work-related purposes only. Student and employee users should use discretion in their choice of materials and information viewed, and should respect current copyright laws.

RESOLUTION NO. 39**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF COUNTY OF ORANGE TO ISSUE AND SELL GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE DISTRICT IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$90,000,000**

- WHEREAS, an election was duly and regularly held in the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (the "District") on February 5, 2008, in accordance with Section 1(b)(3) of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the question whether general obligation bonds should be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$200,000,000 (the "Bonds"), at which more than 55% of the votes cast were in favor of the issuance of the Bonds; and
- WHEREAS, the District is authorized to cause issuance of the Bonds under Chapter 1.5 of Part 10, Division 1, Title 1 of the Education Code of the State of California (the "Bond Law"), commencing with Section 15264 of the Education Code, which requires that general obligation bonds of the District be offered for sale by the Board of Supervisors of County of Orange, as soon as possible following receipt of a resolution adopted by the Board of Education of the District; and
- WHEREAS, Section 15266(b) of the Education Code provides that where not inconsistent, the provisions of Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 15100) of the Education Code shall apply to the Bond Law; and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange (the "County") has previously sold none of the bonds; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District wishes to adopt this Resolution for the purpose of requesting the Board of Supervisors of Orange County to authorize and sell a first series of the Bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$90,000,000;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District the following:

- Section 1. Authorization of Series A Bonds; Request to County.** The Board of Education (the "Board") of the District hereby authorizes the issuance of a first series of the Bonds, to be designated the "Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (Orange County, California) General Obligation Bonds, 2008 Election, Series A" (the "Series A Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$90,000,000 for the purpose of raising money to finance the acquisition, construction, rehabilitation, furnishing and equipping of school facilities as set forth

in the proposition authorizing the issuance of the Bonds (the "Bond Proposition"). The Board hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of County of Orange to issue and sell the Series A Bonds in the name and on behalf of the District under the Bond Law.

- Section 2. Interest.** The Series A Bonds shall bear interest rates of not to exceed the legal limit, payable on February 1 and August 1 in each year beginning August 1, 2008 unless provided otherwise upon the sale of the Series A Bonds.
- Section 3. Maturity.** The Series A Bonds shall mature on August 1 in each of the years and in the respective amounts as set forth in the agreement awarding the sale of the Series A Bonds as hereinafter set forth. The term of the Series A Bonds shall not exceed 25 years.
- Section 4. Approval of County Resolution.** The resolution of the Board of Supervisors authorizing the sale of the Series A Bonds is hereby approved in substantially the form presented to the Board at this meeting (the "County Resolution"). The provisions of the County Resolution relating to payment of principal of and interest on the Series A Bonds are set forth in the County Resolution solely at the request of the District for the convenience of the District in the administration of the Series A Bonds, and do not create any responsibilities for the Board of Supervisors of the County beyond the express statutory requirements contained in Sections 15140, 15146 and 15250 of the Education Code. The District agrees to carry out and perform all of its obligations under the County Resolution.
- Section 5. Building Fund.** The District hereby directs the Orange County Treasurer to establish, hold and maintain a fund to be known as the "Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District Series A General Obligation Bond Building Fund", to be maintained by the Orange County Treasurer as a separate account, distinct from all other funds of the County and the District. The proceeds from the sale of the Series A Bonds, to the extent required under the County Resolution, shall be deposited in and credited to the Building Fund, and shall be expended by the District solely for the purposes for which the Series A Bond proceeds are authorized to be expended under the Bond Proposition, including payment of the costs of issuing the Series A Bonds. All interest and other gain arising from the investment of amounts deposited to the Building Fund shall be retained in the Building Fund and used for the purposes thereof.
- Section 6. Debt Service Fund.** The District hereby directs the Treasurer and Tax Collector of the County (the "County Treasurer") to establish, hold and maintain a fund to be known as the "Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District Series A General Obligation Bond Debt Service Fund", which shall be maintained by the County Treasurer as a separate account, distinct from all other funds of the County and the District. All taxes levied by the County, at the request of the District, for the payment of the principal of and interest and premium (if any) on the Series A

Bonds in accordance with the County Resolution shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund by the County promptly upon apportionment of said levy. The Debt Service Fund shall be pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Series A Bonds when and as the same become due, including the principal of any term Series A Bonds required to be paid upon the mandatory sinking fund redemption thereof. The moneys in the Debt Service Fund, to the extent necessary to pay the principal of and interest and redemption premium (if any) on the Series A Bonds as the same become due and payable, shall be transferred by the County to the Paying Agent upon the written request of the District filed with the County, as required to pay the principal of and interest and redemption premium (if any) on the Series A Bonds.

If, after payment in full of the Series A Bonds, any amounts remain on deposit in the Debt Service Fund, such amounts shall be transferred to the General Fund of the District, as provided in Section 15234 of the Bond Law.

Section 7. Sale of Series A Bonds. The Board hereby requests that the Board of Supervisors of the County sell the Series A Bonds on a negotiated basis to George K. Baum & Company (the "Underwriter") under a Bond Purchase Agreement among the District, the Underwriter and the County Treasurer in substantially the form on file with the clerk of

the District, together with any changes thereto which are approved by the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent, Administrative Services (each, a "District Representative"). The Board hereby authorizes and directs a District Representative to execute and deliver the final form of the Bond Purchase Agreement in the name and on behalf of the District.

The County Treasurer, or any designee thereof, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Bond Purchase Agreement, with such changes therein, deletions therefrom and modifications thereto as the District Representative, may approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof. The bond yield of the Series A Bonds shall not exceed the legal limit and the Underwriter's discount may not exceed 1.1% of the aggregate principal amount of the Series A Bonds sold thereunder. The Bonds shall be sold by negotiated sale inasmuch as: (i) such sale will allow the District to integrate the sale of the Series A Bonds with other public financings undertaken, or to be undertaken, by the District in order to finance and fund public school facilities; (ii) such a sale will allow the District to utilize the services of consultants who are familiar with the financial needs, status and plans of the District; and (iii) such a sale will allow the District to control the timing and structuring of the sale of the Series A Bonds to the municipal bond market and, potentially, take advantage of interest rate opportunities for favorable sale of the Series A Bonds to such market.

Jones Hall, A Professional Law Corporation, has been selected as the District's bond counsel. The estimated costs of issuance associated with the bond sale are \$270,650, excluding underwriter's compensation and bond insurance costs and including bond and underwriter's counsel fees, costs of printing the Official Statement, rating agency fees and paying agent fees. Final complete costs of issuance will be determined and presented to the Board subsequent to sale of the Bonds.

If, it appears in the best interests of the District to acquire municipal bond insurance to secure the Bonds, the Superintendent may so provide in the Purchase Contract.

Section 8. Tax Covenants.

(a) Private Activity Bond Limitation. The District shall assure that the proceeds of the Series A Bonds are not so used as to cause the Series A Bonds to satisfy the private business tests of Section 141(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Tax Code"), or the private loan financing test of Section 141(c) of the Tax Code.

(b) Federal Guarantee Prohibition. The District shall not take any action or permit or suffer any action to be taken if the result of the same would be to cause any of the Series A Bonds to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Tax Code.

(c) Rebate Requirement. The District shall take any and all actions necessary to assure compliance with Section 148(f) of the Tax Code, relating to the rebate of excess investment earnings, if any, to the federal government, to the extent that such section is applicable to the Series A Bonds.

(d) No Arbitrage. The District shall not take, or permit or suffer to be taken by the Paying Agent or otherwise, any action with respect to the proceeds of the Series A Bonds which, if such action had been reasonably expected to have been taken, or had been deliberately and intentionally taken, on the date of issuance of the Series A Bonds would have caused the Series A Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Tax Code.

(e) Maintenance of Tax-Exemption. The District shall take all actions necessary to assure the exclusion of interest on the Series A Bonds from the gross income of the owners of the Series A Bonds to the same extent as such interest is permitted to be excluded from gross income under the Tax Code as in effect on the date of issuance of the Series A Bonds.

Section 9. Preparation of Official Statement. The Board hereby approves, and hereby deems nearly final within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the Preliminary Official Statement describing the Series A Bonds in substantially the form on file with the District. The Board hereby approves and authorizes the distribution by the Underwriter of the Preliminary Official Statement to prospective purchasers of the Series A Bonds, and authorizes and directs a District Representative on behalf of the District to deem the Preliminary Official Statement "final" under Rule 15c2-12 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule") prior to its distribution by the Underwriter. A District Representative is hereby authorized and directed to approve any changes in or additions to a final form of said Official Statement, and the execution thereof by a District

Representative shall be conclusive evidence of his approval of any such changes and additions. The Board hereby authorizes the distribution of the final Official Statement by the Underwriter. The final Official Statement shall be executed in the name and on behalf of the District by a District Representative.

Section 10. Continuing Disclosure. The Board hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the form attached to the Preliminary Official Statement. A District Representative is hereby authorized and directed to assist the Underwriter and Bond Counsel in completing the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, and to execute said Certificate on or prior to the closing of the Series A Bonds.

Section 11. Appointment of Paying Agent. U.S. Bank National Association is hereby appointed to act as the authenticating agent, Bond registrar, transfer agent and paying agent (collectively, the "Paying Agent") for the Series A Bonds. The Paying Agent shall perform such functions as are imposed upon it under the County Resolution.

All fees and expenses incurred for services of the Paying Agent shall be the sole responsibility of the District. The District shall pay to the Paying Agent from time to time reasonable compensation for all services rendered under this Resolution and the County Resolution, and also all reasonable expenses, charges, counsel fees and other disbursements, including those of their attorneys, agents and employees, incurred in and about the performance of their powers and duties under this Resolution and the County Resolution.

Section 12. Actions to Close the Issue. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the District with respect to the sale and issuance of the Series A Bonds are hereby approved, and each District Representative and all other officers of the District are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to do any and all things and take any and all actions relating to the execution and delivery of any and all certificates, requisitions, agreements and other documents, which they, or any of them, may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the lawful issuance and delivery of the Series A Bonds in accordance with this Resolution and the County Resolution.

Section 13. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect on and after its adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. 40

OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT OPPOSING A PETITION FOR THE TRANSFER OF TERRITORY FROM PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT TO THE BREA OLINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (PROPOSED LA FLORESTA PROJECT SITE)

WHEREAS, Education Code section 35700 et seq. sets forth the procedures required for various forms of school district reorganization;

WHEREAS, the reorganization activities addressed by Education Code Section 35700 et seq. include transfers of territory from one school district to another;

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 35753 sets forth nine conditions that must be satisfied before a proposed territory transfer may be approved;

WHEREAS, Chevron Land & Development ("Developer") proposes to develop a master planned community within the City of Brea known as the La Floresta project (the "Project");

WHEREAS, the Project area straddles a portion of the boundary separating the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("PYLUSD") from the Brea Olinda Unified School District ("BOUSD");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 35700(c), Developer has filed a petition with the Orange County Department of Education to transfer the approximately 54 acre portion of the Project area currently lying within PYLUSD to BOUSD;

WHEREAS, the proposed territory transfer fails to satisfy the nine prerequisite conditions set forth in Education Code section 35753;

WHEREAS, PYLUSD is capable of accommodating students generated by the Project;

WHEREAS, there is no evidence that the proposed territory transfer will reduce vehicular traffic or reduce air quality impacts;

WHEREAS, conformance of school district and city boundaries has no bearing on the effective operation of school districts or the quality of the educational services they provide;

WHEREAS, prior transfers of territory between PYLUSD and BOUSD are irrelevant to the Developer's petition;

WHEREAS, the petition fails to identify any compelling reasons supporting approval of the proposed territory transfer;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND FIND AS FOLLOWS:

That the above recitals are all true and correct.

That the PYLUSD Board of Education opposes the petition for transfer of school district territory located within the proposed La Floresta project area from Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District to Brea Olinda Unified School District.
