DETERMINING STEPS TO ENSURE AVAILABILITY OF TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL
MATERIALS FOR 2008-09**

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119 and 60422(b), the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days' notice of the public hearing or hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the district and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9-12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 16, 2008, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics
- (ii) Science
- (iii) History-social science
- (iv) English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2008-2009 school year, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District provides each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2008-09 school year, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District has provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board, to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course and that sufficient laboratory science equipment applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 – 12, inclusive, is available to pupils.

UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

The Board of Education recognizes that the District is primarily responsible for complying with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The District shall investigate:

1. Complaints alleging failure to comply with such laws and/or alleging discrimination and shall seek to resolve those complaints in accordance with the district's uniform complaint procedures. The district shall follow uniform complaint procedures when addressing complaints (1) alleging unlawful discrimination against any protected group as identified in state and federal law, including actual or perceived sex, sexual orientation, gender, ethnic group identification, race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, mental or physical disability, or age, or on the basis of a person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics in any program or activity that receives or benefits from state financial assistance, or any basis that is contained in the prohibition of hate crimes set forth in Subdivision (a) Section 422.6 of the Penal Code (see E 1312.3), or (2) alleging failure to comply with state or federal law in adult education, career technical and technical education/training programs, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs, consolidated categorical programs, migrant education, and special education programs.
2. Complaints related to sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials, emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health or safety of students or staff, and teacher vacancies and misassignments pursuant to the Williams Settlement.

The Board encourages the early informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible.

The Board acknowledges and respects every individual's right to privacy. Discrimination complaints shall be investigated in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the integrity of the process. This may include keeping the identity of the complainant confidential, as appropriate and except to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or proceedings, as determined by the Superintendent or designee, on a case-by-case basis. The Board prohibits any form of retaliation against any complainant in the complaint process, including but not limited to a complainant's filing of a complaint, the reporting of instances of discrimination, or for participation in complaint procedures. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status, grades, or work assignments of the complainant.

The Board recognizes that a neutral mediator can often suggest a compromise that is agreeable to all parties in a dispute. In accordance with uniform complaint procedures, whenever all parties to a complaint agree to try resolving their problem through mediation, the Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services shall initiate that process and ensure that the results are consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure the employees designated to investigate complaints are knowledgeable about the laws and programs for which they are responsible. Such employees may have access to legal counsel as determined by the Superintendent or designee.

In compliance with state law, when 15% or more of the students in the district speak a single primary language other than English, notification regarding Uniform Complaint Procedures shall also be provided in that language.
